The following instructions are to help you understand and enjoy the 126th New York State Conference. We hope you will return to your chapter refreshed with new enthusiasm and commitment to our National Society's mission.

CREDENTIALS: Chapter Regents - your chapter's Credentials form should already be sent to the Credentials Committee in order to register the voters

for your chapter. Do not delay any longer and submit the form before August 24. State Bylaws Article VIII, Section 7 states, "Uniform credential blanks with a letter of instruction shall be sent to the Regent of each Chapter". The duly elected delegates and alternates shall be listed on the credential blanks. A copy shall be sent to the State Regent and to the Chair of the Credentials Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the State Conference. Only a chapter member whose credentials have been completed in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 shall be eligible to represent her Chapter at meetings of the State Organization." Please note that only those legally entitled to vote in accordance with the State Bylaws may vote, make motions or take part in debates. Voters will be given a voter's ribbon. This badge must be worn at all times.

REPRESENTATION: Delegates and Alternates are representatives of their chapters. They must be elected in the same ratio and with the same qualifications as for Continental Congress as provided by National Bylaws, Article XV, Sections 2 and 3.

ATTENDANCE: ALL New York DAR members and their family members are invited to attend State Conference, not just Chapter Delegates and Alternates. Make your plans now to attend. Each member who is attending State Conference for the first time will be recognized by wearing a New Attendee ribbon and is encouraged to attend the Welcome Dinner held on Thursday evening.

REGISTRATION: Everyone who attends State Conference MUST register: Voters, Alternates, Members, HODARS, Volunteers and Guests. Please pre-register by September 1, 2022, using the Conference Registration section on the Meals Reservation Form. All those attending State Conference, whether for one hour or three days, must register and be issued a Name Badge. No one will be permitted into the business sessions, meals, exhibit areas or workshops without a Name Badge.

REGISTRATION FEE: A registration fee of \$20 will be charged to all members, except Pages, attending the 126th New York State Conference. All guests, except guests of Conference, C.A.R. members, and HODARS, must pay a non-member registration fee of \$10. Please send in your registration fee by September 1, 2022. **The fee for late and on-site registration will be \$30.**

Please be sure to stop by the registration table to pick up your name badge and conference packet and to be included in the official attendance count. You will also pick up your meal reservation tickets at check-in.

Delegates and Alternates must be signed in with the Credentials Committee before 9 a.m. on Saturday, September 24. If your chapter's voting representative falls ill or has an emergency and cannot fulfill the voting obligations of your chapter, that representative **MUST** advise the Credentials Committee and supply a letter and transfer the voting badge to the alternate in order to give your chapter the proper votes permitted. All voters must be seated in the section selected and restricted by the Pages and wearing their red voter's badge at the beginning of the Business Session on Saturday morning.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Included in this issue of the *Empire State News* is a report of the State Nominating Committee which was elected during the 2021 State Conference. Listed are the proposed candidates for State Office. These are the offices for which voting will take place at the 126th New York State Conference, as well as to elect the members of the 2022-2023 Nominating Committee. The State Officers-elect will be installed in 2023 during the 132nd Continental Congress in Washington, D.C., at the New York Luncheon and will serve from July 2023 - July 2026.

ELECTION OF THE 2022-2023 STATE NOMINATING COMMITTEE:

In accordance with New York State Bylaws, Article V, Section 1, "A Nominating Committee to consist of seven members, each from a different Judicial District shall be elected by ballot at each State Conference." This Nominating

Committee will nominate the candidates for State Directors of Districts I, II & XII, District V, and District VIII, who in turn will serve from 2024 – 2027.

REGENTS OF DISTRICTS I, II & XII, IX, X & XI: You will be honored by processing into the Business Meeting at Opening Session on Friday morning, September 23, and you will sit in the front seats reserved for you. You will be introduced by your District Directors. Please make sure that all Chapters of Districts I, II & XII, IX, X & XI have a Regent or Regent's Representative in the Processional Formation Room at 8:45 a.m., and that your District Directors have your name pronounced and spelled correctly for your introduction.

Hostess chapters are reminded to bring their DAR banners and stands (clearly marked) to State Conference, and to pick them up at the end of Conference -- or they may be forever lost!

WONDERING WHAT TO WEAR? Daytime attire is a dress, skirts and blouses, suits and pant suits. (Please, no jeans, tank tops or flip-flops.) Formal attire, such as an evening gown, cocktail dress or formal pant suit, is best for the evening and especially for the Saturday banquet. More subtle and subdued attire is appropriate to wear to the Sunday morning Memorial Services. Yes! You may wear your hats. Reporting at State Conference?

Here is what you need to know!

You are required to prepare oral and written reports to inform members of the activities of your office or committee. Written reports are due before September 10, 2022. Oral reports are given at the NYS Conference to be held September 22 - 25, 2022, as indicated in the Conference program. Please follow these guidelines to prepare and distribute your reports.

Written Report:

This report covers work from October 2021 to September 2022 and is due before September 10, 2022. It is to be published in the New York State Yearbook and serves to highlight your accomplishments in a brief synopsis of no more than 400 words. In addition to an overview, information regarding contests and awards should be included. Prepare your written report as follows:

- Head your report with your name and office or committee, and on the next line, State Conference 2022. Do not use a letterhead.

Example:

Jane Doe, State Chair American Heritage
State Conference 2022

- Use 8 1/2" x 11" page, single spaced
- Use New Times Roman font, 10 or 12 point.
- Use a left margin of at least 1 inch (for binding).
- Number pages if more than one page.

Make sure your written report is sent as a Word document (not a PDF) and is no more than 400 words. If you are unable to attend State Conference, you must still submit your report by September 10, 2022, to be filed.

Oral Report:

Oral reports are given at the NYS Conference to be held September 22 - 25, 2022. You will read this report at the time indicated in the Conference program and must not exceed two minutes. You may read an abbreviated version of your written report in order to meet the time limit.

Prepare your oral report as follows:

- Your salutation is "Madam State Regent." Do not address anyone else, even if the President General is present.
- Make your report engaging and interesting.
- Mention only first-place award winners as doing otherwise can quickly fill your two minutes.
- Keep your oral report to 250-300 words to stay within the allotted time.
- Practice reading aloud/timing your oral report beforehand.
- Do not write or say "respectfully submitted" at the end of your report.

Standing Rules for the 126th State Conference, New York State Organization, NSDAR

REGISTRATION & SEATING

1. Delegates, Alternates and voting members must register by 9:00 a.m. Saturday, September 24, 2022. Others may register until 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 24, 2022.
2. Everyone attending State Conference must register. The badge issued at that time must be worn at all business meetings or any portion thereof.
3. A Regent or Delegate leaving before the close of Conference shall transfer her badge to her Alternate (if the Alternate is remaining) and notify the Chair of the Credentials Committee in writing.
4. A member registered as an Alternate may be transferred, upon proper clearance by the Credentials Committee, from Alternate to Delegate before the official close of registration.
5. All meetings shall begin promptly at the time announced.
6. On Election Day, Chapter Regents and Delegates shall be in the seats reserved for voting members before the opening of the session.
7. Doors shall be closed during speeches, reports and musical numbers.

RECOMMENDATIONS & REPORTS

8. Recommendations submitted by the State Board of Management shall be presented directly to the Conference by the State Recording Secretary.
9. Reports of committees shall be limited to two (2) minutes each. Reports of State Officers and State Chairs not present shall be filed unless otherwise ordered.
10. All reports and other materials for the State Yearbook shall be typewritten, single spaced and

ready for printing. They shall be transmitted electronically to the State Vice Regent and State Recording Secretary prior to the meeting at which presented.

RESOLUTIONS

11. Courtesy resolutions shall be voted upon immediately after presentation to the Conference.

MOTIONS

12. Each motion offered during Conference shall be in writing, signed by the maker and seconded, each of whom shall be a voting member of the Conference, and shall be sent immediately to the State Regent and then to the desk of the State Recording Secretary. The maker of the motion shall rise, be recognized by the presiding officer and shall state her name and chapter before proposing her motion.

DEBATE

13. Only registered voters may speak in debate. Debates shall be limited to two (2) minutes for each speaker for each question. No member shall speak for longer than two (2) minutes nor more than once on the same question without the permission of the Conference, granted by a two-thirds vote without debate.

NOMINATIONS & VOTING

14. Nominating speeches shall be limited to one nominating speech of two (2) minutes for each candidate.
15. Election of State Officers and a Nominating Committee of seven (7) members shall take place on Saturday, September 24, 2022. Polls shall open at 9:30 a.m., September

24, 2022. Polls shall close at 11:30 a.m. September 24, 2022.

MISCELLANEOUS

16. Any business unfinished at the time of recess shall be resumed at the next business session.
17. Notices for announcements to the Conference shall be in writing, signed by the person (or a proper representative of the person) under whose authority the announcement is issued and shall be sent to the desk of the State Recording Secretary.

PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

18. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Conference in all cases in which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the bylaws of the National Society, the New York State Organization, and these Standing Rules.

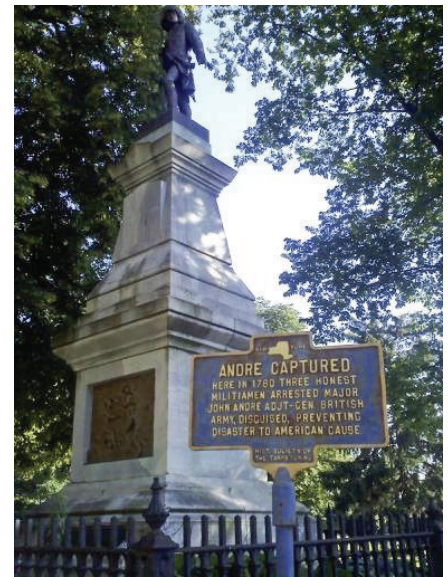

Lots to do in Tarrytown!

Tarrytown is located on the eastern bank of the Hudson River, approximately 25 miles north of Midtown Manhattan.

Consider visiting its Patriot's Park on Route 9 along its boundary with Sleepy Hollow. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, it is located near the site that British Major John André was captured, disguised in civilian clothing, by three Patriot militiamen in 1780. They found papers in his shoe that implicated him in espionage with Benedict Arnold, and Andre was later executed across the Hudson as a spy. A memorial was erected on the site in 1853, on land donated by members of the local African American community. Its Captors' Monument was one of the earliest monuments to honor any event of the Revolutionary War.

Other famous attractions here include Gothic Revival masterpiece Lyndhurst, Washington Irving's Sunnyside, the Tarrytown Lighthouse and the Westchester River Walk. You may also want to visit the Sleepy Hollow Cemetery, founded in 1849. Famous burials include those of Washington Irving, Andrew Carnegie, Walter Chrysler, Samuel Gompers, Elizabeth Arden, Leona Helmsley, Brooke Astor, and William Rockefeller.
